RBG- Ruth Bader Ginsburg- I Dissent

I Dissent, a live biography of Ruth Bader Ginsburg, is a unique, rarely seen version of a one-woman performance by Sheryl Faye. You will see RBG grow from a young girl to a Supreme Court Justice before your eyes in a one act performance: no intermission. Her performance will immerse you in a multimedia learning experience that will captivate you and pique your interest in the character making you want to learn more about RBG. It will be approximately 1 hour with the possibility of asking Sheryl questions regarding her performance and preparation for performances. She does perform as other female historical women.

The I Dissent performance as our major fund raiser for 2025 to support the two one-thousand-dollar (\$1,000) scholarship we award each April for two mature women who are re-entering higher education institutions to continue or advance their current degree. This event replaces The Lemonade Stand previously held during the Lake Wales Arts Festival in February. Your participation in this event is less labor intensive, time consuming and will be enjoyable! In place of the lake, the venue will be The Vanguard School's lovely Performing Arts Center on Highway 27 S in Lake Wales. Do you have three friends or relatives or both who would buy tickets to attend a unique and educational event? Tickets will make wonderful Hanukkah or Christmas gifts! Our goal is to sell as many tickets as we can, up to 220, that is the capacity of the theater at Vanguard! If tickets sales exceed our expectations, it will provide flexibility with the scholarships; either in increasing from 2 to 3, increasing the amount of the scholarships or initiating a long-awaited STEM project. A large audience would leave the actress with a positive impression of the AAUW Lake Wales membership and by support demonstrated by the Lake Wales community. Please do all you can to support this event as it will take all of us to achieve our goals.

The program is appropriate for all age groups, especially middle and high school students and even men! Ticket prices will include a reduced-price ticket for students and adult price will not exceed \$25. Credit cards will be accepted. AAUW Lake Wales is a nonprofit corporation (501(c)(3) so tickets can be a donation. Printed information such as posters and information cards will be available at the Branch Meeting on November 20th.
